### 2024 PGCEA General Election Guide

PGCEA's governance structure is similar to the state (MSEA) and national (NEA) affiliates. Each organization conducts its own election. The PGCEA Nominations, Elections and Credentials Commission (NECC) holds general elections annually in which the members choose their officers, directors, delegates, and union policies.

On the following pages, you will find the information presented, as written, by the candidates for President (one seat available, serves a three year term 2024-2027), Vice President (one seat available, serves a three year term 2024-2027), PGCEA Board of Directors-At-Large (four seats available, each serves a two year term 2024-2026). Also, included is a list of candidates for NEA Delegates and MSEA Delegates. See PGCEA By-laws, Policy Handbook and Fair Campaign Practice Code for details.

**BOARD OF DIRECTORS** (BOD) is composed of three elected officers (president, vice president, and treasurer) plus eight elected at-large members.

UNION ELECTIONS

The Board is responsible for the fiscal affairs and general management of the Association, the interpretation of policies, the preparation of the proposed budget, and much more. The PGCEA Board of Directors sets the course for PGCEA and decides how to use its staff and resources.

**MSEA and NEA DELEGATES** represent PGCEA's interests at the annual state (MSEA) and national (NEA) Representative Assemblies. There are three types of delegates; two are elected in the PGCEA general election:

Election	Delegate
PGCEA (October)	PGCEA MSEA Delegates discuss and vote on proposed bylaw amendments, new business items and resolutions for MSEA.
PGCEA (July)	PGCEA NEA Delegates adopt the strategic plan and budget, resolutions, the legislative program, and other policies of NEA.
MSEA (July)	STATE: MSEA Delegates to the NEA Representative Assembly and Convention elect the executive officers, Executive Committee members, and atlarge members of the NEA Board of Directors, as appropriate.

**BY-LAWS** The PGCEA By-Laws are the governing documents of the Association. They may only be changed once a year by a super majority of 66% of those casting a ballot.

There are no proposed by-law amendments on the ballot.

PGCEA, MSEA and NEA collectively advocate for educators employed by the public school system. They are the educators' protector in employment related matters, wage and benefits watchdogs and organizers who fight for fair

I am Dr. Suzanne Windsor, a graduate of Gwynn Park High School entering my 31st year as an educator and a member of PGCEA here in gorgeous Prince George's County. I began my career as an intern at Largo HS and Kenmoor MS before becoming a full-time English teacher at Crossland HS. As a new teacher, I was assigned to all 9th grade classes and floated every period; thus, I am familiar with the struggles of being new. Later, as an English teacher for seniors, I assisted colleagues by providing coverage at nearby elementary schools during crises. This inspired me to become a Professional School Counselor (PSC) and my internship included work in early childhood, elementary, and secondary education. After serving as a PSC, I became the

Chairperson for my department where I advocated for counselor working conditions, as my peers were frequently denied their contractual rights- even a duty-free lunch. From these experiences, I decided to increase my advocacy and became a Pupil Personnel Worker (PPW). In my role as a PPW, I was assigned to many schools across the county and noticed a common thread in how my colleagues were not being treated in the professional manner that ALL Unit 1 members should be- both as a matter of principal and, more importantly, in accordance with our binding agreement with management through our Negotiated Agreement.

In my stand for justice, I have taken on increasing levels of responsibility in PGCEA. As a member of the Board of Directors, I worked diligently with leadership to ensure that a committee was in place to address contract language and member concerns. The Grievance Committee was born and evolved into the Contract Enforcement Committee during my tenure as the Vice President of PGCEA.

As the Vice President of PGCEA, I work to ensure that all members are not only paid a professional salary but treated with the dignity and respect due us! To accomplish this, I have: chaired the Negotiations Committee with a phenomenal team of educators during our last negotiation; currently serve as the PGCEA Liaison to the Community Schools Steering Committee; participate in the PGCPS-PGCEA Evaluation Workgroup; and work with the Government Relations Committee to ensure that our concerns go before the legislature. I have also served on the: MSEA President's Advisory Council, MSEA Women's Concerns Committee, MSEA Minority Caucus, MSEA Asian American Pacific Islander Caucus, and the MSEA Native American Caucus.

To round out my leadership experience, I am nationally certified as a hearing official by the National Association of Hearing Officials (NAHO); held the position of Treasurer with the former Maryland Association of School Discipline Hearing Officers (MASDHO); Secretary for the Maryland Association of Administrative Law Judges (MAALJ); and Co-chaired the Ethics Committee for Maryland Association of Pupil Personnel (MAPP). 
