## The Elementary/ECC Challenge

	Student Day	Total Minutes In a Student Day
Early Childhood Centers	6 hours 10 min	370
Elementary	6 hours 10 min	370 minutes

Prince George's County has the shortest student day than any other LEA in the state.

#### ECC's

- The 4 year old program is full day and in the ECCs and students do not attend school on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays for planning and case management.
- The 3 year old program in the ECCs is half-day and students do not attend on Wednesdays for planning and case management.

#### **Implications**

- Limiting teacher planning time to the student day only is problematic.
  - Doubling classes
  - Increased pressure on creative arts teachers as schedules are stacked back to back to accommodate all Unit 1 members during the limited student day hours.
  - Limits opportunities for innovative scheduling
  - Impacts maximizing instructional time with students

Major Concern: Overall quality of planning time.

#### Planning Period

Teachers have 45 minute planning periods; one for lunch and one planning.



#### Why Collaborative Planning

#### **PGCPS Counters**

- 1. Unit I members will be provided a half day each quarter once a month each quarter for individual Unit I member directed planning time at an alternative worksite of their choice.

  Reject Keep original language
- 2. Teacher planning time will be scheduled in accordance with the following procedures and shall be Unit member directed:
- a. Secondary schools: The principal/supervisor shall schedule a minimum continuous block of forty-five (45) sixty (60) forty-five (45) minutes daily of planning time for each Unit 1 member during the student day duty day. A minimum of two days per week a teacher shall receive planning for a full class period.

b. Elementary Schools, Early Childhood Centers, Early Childhood Programs, and Special Education Centers: The principal/supervisor shall schedule a minimum of <del>240</del> <del>280</del> 240 minutes of planning time for each Unit I member per regular work week of five normal workdays of which a minimum of 200 240 minutes shall be scheduled per week during the student day and during the duty day in daily blocks of no less than 40 minutes where possible. The additional 40 minutes can be seheduled outside the student day and shall be in blocks not less than 20 minutes, where possible. The principal/supervisor will provide the planning time schedule at least one week in advance and changes will only be made in the event of unforeseeable circumstances

Note: We cannot honor the additional time across all schools consistently beyond what is proposed.
